
Midland-Odessa Area Economic Summary




Average weekly wages for all industries by county Midland-Odessa, third quarter 2024 (U.S. = \$1,394; Area = \$1,701)

Employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector, over-the-year changes




